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Recruitment at CMA in Xiamen was very successfully during summer in July 2009, so Wang Sen-liang suggested Tai to hire more people due to the understaff problem.

Chen Maosen at that time came to visit CMA, Tai then asked him to join CMA. After few days of consideration, Chen Maosen agreed to join CMA. Since Chen loves educating children, he quickly learned how to handle all tasks in CMA. In November 2009, Chen also received teacher training and completed teaching internship courses. Soon he became the teacher of CMA in Xiamen. Within one year and nine months of teaching in Xiamen, Chen's teaching performance was recognised by Tai.

In January 2011, Chen got married and began to think about starting his own enterprise. When he talked with Tai, he knew he might have chance to obtain CMA's agent authority in Xiamen. In early January 2011, Chen Maosen talked with Chen Chai, the person in charge of CMA in Xiamen, that he wanted to conduct an exploration in Fuzhou, hoping to established his career there. Chen Chai then encouraged him to establish the agent office of CMA in Fuzhou.

During spring festival in 2011, Chen Maosen went to Fuzhou for an exploration trip. He believed Fuzhou could be a good place to establish an office because it is capital of Fujian, a leading city of West Coast Economic Zone. The city is prosperous and flourishing in cultural education, thus he was determined that it is a great vision in development of the city. After two months of preparation with Tai's assistance, he established the agent office of CMA in Fuzhou and officially opened on April 8, 2011.

Chen Maosen believed the future of CMA in Fuzhou to be bright because the teaching system of CMA was amazing. In addition to the efforts he made, he believed the operation of CMA in Fuzhou to be very successful.

War of competing for agent authority in Indonesia

There are about 35 million Chinese overseas, and 90% of them lived in Southeast Asia. However, the Chinese in Indonesia marked

the 3% of population in Indonesia. Comparing to Malaysia, the Chinese marked the 26% of total population. That means the Chinese in Indonesia not only have to make extra efforts to have successful life, they need to obtained higher degree and more professional skills. We can imagine that there will be many cultural education institutes, talent training classes, and potential training courses provided in Indonesia for Chinese.

Thus, the agent authority of CMA in Indonesia is more competitive. The candidates were Prescilla Ang MS and another group of people (three Indonesians and two Singaporeans, two of whom can speak Chinese).
